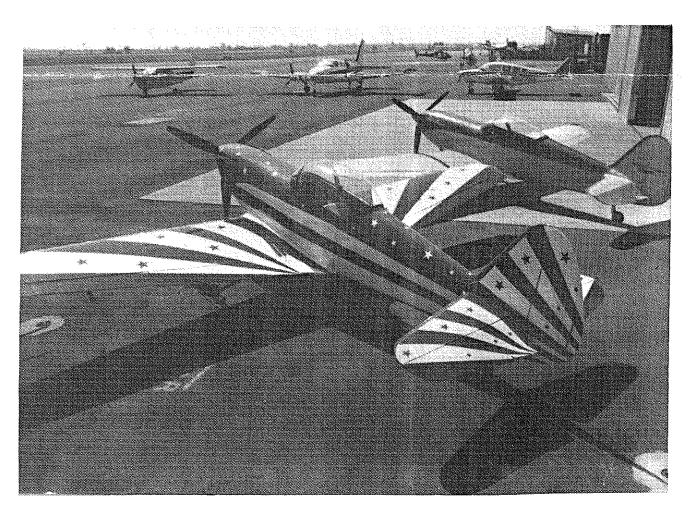

We thought you would like to see the original *Prowler* and the *Jaguar* in a side by side comparison photo. This was taken in October. Follow the outline carefully and you can see the only noticable difference between the two is the canopy.

Actually there are a number of changes we have incorporated into your new Jaguar. The cockpit has more room. The Fuselage has a little wider curve due to the cockpit enlargement. The canopy has the most noticable change, and is due to the taller pilots of the post WW II era. The cowling is a bit wider in order to fit the 350 V-8 engine; and also blends perfectly into the slightly wider fuselage curve. The spinner is not quite as pointed. The 350 hp engine is of course, the key development made to the aircraft. We have made many other small changes that we will not take the time to list here. Our policy has always been, that what-ever changes we make in the aircraft, we will always incorportate those into the current manufacturing process.

From the PRODUCTION DEPARTMENT

As always, we are hard at work here in the shop producing the quality parts needed for our customers and future builders.

For whatever reason, we did not mention in our last letter our newest employee, Dave Jungkeit. Dave came to us just before Christmas and I would like to say that he has become a real asset to us. Dave is now the Shop Foreman and can handle most of the questions you may have regarding production. So, if I am out on an errand you can now get the information needed from Dave. His past record is quite impressive and would fill a few pages of anyones resume. So, all of our present and future customers, take note; that we are continuing to do our best to provide you with Quality Craftmanship by selecting outstanding personnel. Welcome aboard Dave!!

Since our last letter in January, Fuselage Production has just about been completed. We are now in full swing on the Landing Gear Kits (now finished wing, or kit #3). We are producing 15 kits at this time and it requires alot of set-up time. We are now spending many long hours standing at the mill (or lathe). As of this date, the Gear Knees and Caps are bored, rough cut and awaiting final shaping. The Upper Gear legs have been Hard Anodized and the Lower Legs just came back from the Chrome Shop looking great. The Lower Axle Yoke is rough cut and awaiting final shaping. So, as you can see, there has not been too many idle hours in my department.

So that you will know how we are doing on manufacturing of the Gear; there is still machining to do on the Over Gear Locks and Brackets, Scissors, Up-Lock Brackets, Sequence Valves, Hydraulic Cylinders and Leg Caps. It looks like George and I will be spending a lot of time together in the machine shop this spring.

George is also hard at work building 3 engines. This coupled with his machining chores on the landing gear and flying the *Jaguar* in the mornings really keep him busy.

While I am writing this to you; George and Dave are in the process of making a plaster cast of the *Jaguar* Engine Cowling. We will use this in the very near future to fabricate permanent tooling for Hydro-pressing the finished and ready to install Cowling parts. It looks like I will now have to add an (RN) rating to their record files.

Ray Seim was at our plant the other day and picked up his Fuselage Kit. We had the opportunity to visit with Ray and want to thank him for his support and efforts in assisting us with all of the little questions that come up from time to time. By the way, George visited Ray's workshop last month and commented to us on the very high quality level of workmanship that Ray was putting into his Airplane Assembly. I believe George said that "he is a real Craftsman". Congratulations Ray!!

On a final note, we had the Propeller custom painted by American Propeller Corp. here in Redding. We received it back in-house yesterday. The paint scheme matches the fuselage Blue, with Red and White Stars and really looks impressive. I want to add that American Propeller is coming out with a line of Designer Prop. Schemes and will be more than happy to accommodate anyones wishes in that regard. This Program will really add some 'flare' to a personalized paint scheme.

Time to close, the lathe awaits and in looking at my schedule, the Tailwheel Struts are next in line. As always, I look forward to your calls and am looking forward to some new faces and builders in the very near future.

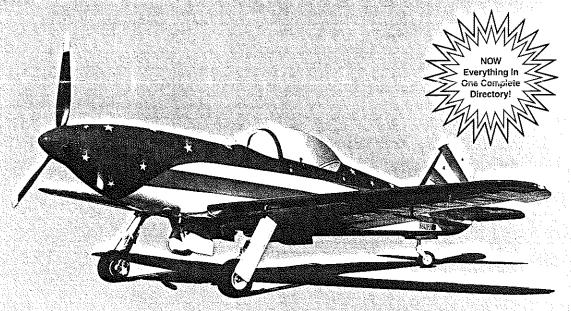

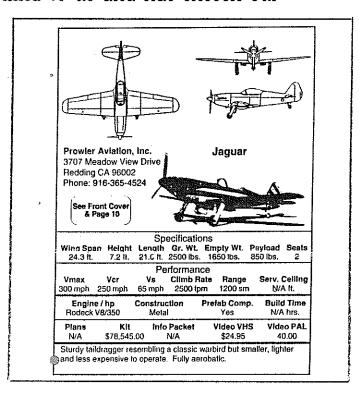

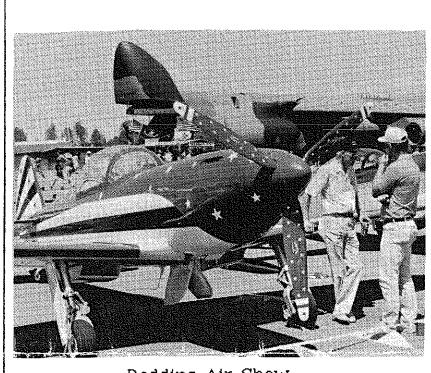


It seems just like yesterday that I sat down and wrote the last issue of the Growler. We have had an exciting Spring and Summer. Here are some of the events we participated in

In mid May we started our Air Show involvement for 1993, with a local air show in Corning, California. We were able to fly the Jaguar directly to this show from our plant here in Redding. Although we were not able to fly the aircraft during the show, we were able to display both the Prowler and the Jaguar. Again we were afforded prime location space, directly in front of the main gate. We fielded the usual number of questions from tire kickers to very interested parties. For a small commnuity such as this, the local sponsers really put on a great show. Congratulations to our friends in Corning.

May 22-23 we participated in the Redding Air Show. This is a hightly rated show and has a well organized program. The local

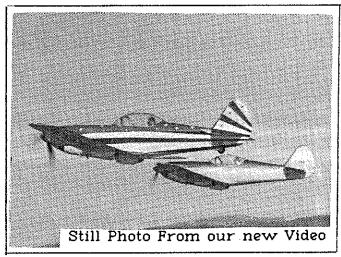
business clubs are deeply involved in this very smooth running, spectator oriented organization. We were unable to fly here since the show was a Demonstration and Military event. However, we again had a great location and our sales team was able to make many contacts with the flying public.

One of the truly good things that came out of the Redding show was the involvement of Mr. Wayne Handly (of the Raven fame). Wayne was able to give the Jaguar the final "wring out". Wayne flew the Jaguar the day before the air show and was pleased with the very powerful response of the 350hp engine. One of the very

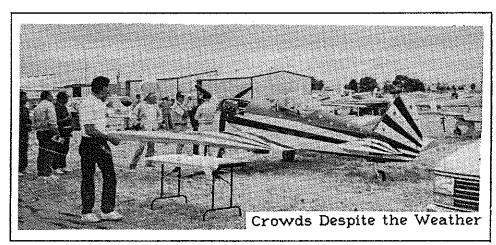
favorable developments was when Wayne had not realized that he had passed the cruise speed of 250 mph, as there was so little wind noise. He was quite surprised that he was flying that fast. Wayne also said that he felt the steady pull of the 350 hp engine on climbing after a dive. He stated that the original *Prowler* seemed to slow up quite a bit in this sort of climb, but the 350



Jaguar just kept right on going. We knew that this would be a plus and we wanted to pass it along to you. We just can't wait to get this first round of kits in the air.

June 4th we were at the Merced Antique Fly In. This California show was one that I personally found to be the most informative.

Everyone who passed by the display was knowledgble about the inner workings of all aircraft and most engines. I feel it was I who learned the most from the contacts



with these highly informed people. Tire kickers they were not, these pilots really knew their stuff. The weather in Merced was not necessarily accommodating, but we were able to fly and demonstrate the wonderful abilities of the Jaguar.

On June 19th and 20th we were in Ukiah, California for the two day air show. This was much different than the previous show.

Hot, Hot weather was the main course. Barbara Phillips, Donna Logan and Kathleen Morse, bravely endured the 100 degree plus temperatures in the humid valley of Ukiah. Bob Logan and



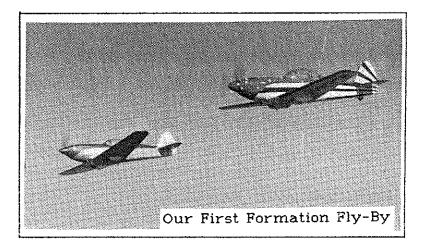
George Morse flew the Prowler and the Jaguar side by side in formation for the very first time. We were able to show the aircraft performance abilities at this show. It was really neat to see them in formation fly-by. All of the Air Show participants were treated to seeing some of the WWII aces, who were also present in a special hanger. Many books were autographed and many stories shared. I can still see those older hands in the air describing position of the aircraft in dogfighting tactics.

At the end of June and the begining of July, Prowler crossed another threshold. As of this writing we are in the process of producing a Professional Video featuring our aircraft. We are telling the whole story, from point of manufacture to droping the landing gear down for the final aproach, the Jaguar is represented as never before in a video that will match up with anything our competetors have. Mr Roger Tonray of Brad Christian Films is utalizing his highly skilled touch in the filming and production. We have of course, seen most of the uncut video and are very, very impressed with the results. This should give us a marketing advantage that we have never had before. If you are wondering

THE LAST TIME I WROTE TO YOU, I BELIEVE WE WERE HARD AT WORK ON THE FUSELAGE. I AM NOW AT WORK ON THE LANDING GEAR AND WILL BE FOR SOME TIME TO COME. AGAIN, WE HAVE DECIDED TO SIMPLIFY THINGS FOR OUR BUILDERS AND THIS MAY MEAN A LITTLE SETBACK ON TESTING AND TOOLING CHANGES. HOWEVER, IN THE LONG RUN, THIS WILL MEAN A BETTER PRODUCT, AND THIS IS WHAT WE ARE ALWAYS STRIVING FOR AT PROWLER.

DR. ROGERS WAS WELCOMED ABOARD IN OUR LAST GROWLER AND HAS SINCE BEEN HARD AT WORK ON HIS EMPENNAGE KIT. HE IS DOING US THE PROUD SERVICE OF TESTING OUR NEWLY WRITTEN ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS AND SO FAR THINGS ARE GOING TOGETHER WELL FOR HIM. WE KNOW THAT WE ARE ON THE RIGHT TRACK AND OUR INSTRUCTIONS ARE BETTER THAN EVER. WE HOPE THOSE OF YOU WHO HAVE NOT COME ABOARD WILL DO SO QUICKLY.

WELL, HAVE TO GO NOW. GOTTA FIX THE SANDER. ONE OF MY ASSIGNED DUTIES IS SHOP REPAIR.

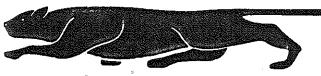
